Students in Years 10 and 11 will all visit a range of FE providers and a great many students have experienced a University visit. <u>PODCASTING WITH DAVID SCOT</u>

Over the course of 12 weeks, the podcast series aims to create a safe space for young men to discuss masculinity, reflect on their experiences, and learn from each other. By engaging in this project, participants will develop critical thinking and media production skills, fostering a sense of accomplishment and community.

THE POET IN RESIDENCE PROJECT

An initiative in collaboration with Manchester Metropolitan University and Manchester Art Gallery, where Year 8 students create work inspired by the theme "Our World, Our Future." Students engage in erasure poetry and multimedia projects, exploring the intersection of art, expression, and global issues.



RESTORE THE MUSIC

A music charity partner that has helped to provide new technology and musical equipment to our students. This has been beneficial for our department as the new variety of equipment has given the students to ability to play

instruments and grow as musicians. The relationship is strong as Mr Hatton is the Manchester High School's representative for the charity and helps to provide advice to other teachers within the charity scheme. There has also been an event in partnership with Restore the music, Casio Keyboards and Manchester City Footballer Nathan Ake, where the students were able to meet one of their idols, whilst showing off their musical skills. The event garnered national attention, being showcased on ITV news and a Martin Samuel piece within the sports section of The Times.

FEED MY CITY

Feed My City (Foundation) is an Emergency Food Charity which provides dry food bags and hot meals to those in most need. They believe that every human being has the right to basic food and this should not be dependent on them having money. They aim to provide simple, free, vegetarian, nourishing hot food and/ or emergency food bags in our local area. Some of the ingredients

used in the cooking are grown in the Beswick Urban Garden (BUG) which is located on site at TEMA. This year our student leadership team have helped to support the charity cooking and delivering meals from their hub in Beswick on a weekly basis.

THE COMINO FOUNDATION

The COMINO Foundation is a charity dedicated to empowering individuals and communities by providing tailored support services that promote social opportunity, personal development, and practical skill-building. Partnering with the COMINO Foundation aligns with our commitment to providing holistic support for our students, helping them thrive both academically and personally. Their comprehensive services offer students valuable opportunities



to build confidence, develop essential life skills, and overcome challenges.

By collaborating with COMINO, we ensure our students are equipped with the tools they need to succeed in both their educational journeys and future endeavours. Additionally, we participate in events throughout the year that focus on developing students' skills to transition into further education and employment. All partnerships are with top-

performing companies and institutes, and students have the unique opportunity to work with professionals from the sector, gaining real-world experience and insights that help shape their futures. This year, we are running 10 projects across different curriculum areas, providing students with diverse opportunities to engage, learn, and grow in collaboration with industry leaders and experts.

THE SCHOOL LIFE TO PUBLIC LIFE PROJECT

In partnership with Bury North's Labour MP, this is the third year of the project, which engages 60 students in learning about the Nolan Principles. Four students will then visit Westminster for a tour of the Houses of Parliament, experiencing the workings of Parliament firsthand in the House of Commons.





THE ENVIRONMENTALIST IN RESIDENCE PROJECT

In collaboration with the sustainability charity, Eco Vida Routes and RHS Bridgewater. A project involving 30 students exploring critical environmental issues and their roles as future consumers, citizens, employers, and entrepreneurs. Students will devise their own small-scale sustainability programs, guided by industry professionals, placing them

at the forefront of efforts to address global sustainability challenges.

THE TALES TO INSPIRE PROJECT

A unique project offering 10 students the opportunity to work with renowned writer Krish Patel to have their life stories written and published in a book. The project aims to foster empathy and inspire positive change by sharing powerful narratives. With the support of industry professionals, the project creates a space for storytelling that promotes growth, inclusion, and empowerment.





FACTORY INTERNATIONAL, AVIVA STUDIOS

As a school we have had the amazing opportunity to develop a partnership with Factory International over at Aviva Studios. The has allowed us to provide opportunities for our students to experience life within the creative

industry; networking with professionals, gaining experience of various roles in the workplace, touring real working music, sound, and performance studios, and gaining knowledge of the routes available when entering creative careers. Many students applied and the successful 20 worked with external artists in school, learning how to put on a real exhibition to the public. Finally, they had a full day at Aviva Studios working with lighting technicians, performers, and sound technicians to put on their own show. Students felt that during this programme they built their creativity, confidence, teamwork skills, and knowledge of creative careers.

THE ROYAL EXCHANGE THEATRE

Over the last four years, The East Manchester Academy has had a successful partnership with The Royal Exchange Theatre Company and over 400 students have been involved in various visits and trips, workshops, performances and intensive projects. The Great Expectations Curtain Raiser

required students to create a 'curtain raiser'

for Great Expectations, inspired by some of the themes from the production. The students explored multiple art forms and created a beautiful piece of theatre which was performed to a live audience in The Great Hall before the main house production. The pieces focused on different forms of inequality that the students wanted to highlight such as misogyny, racism, bullying, mental health, women's rights and more. Giving the students autonomy over what was created and a public platform to be heard contributed to the success of the project for both the school and the theatre.

The partnership with The Royal Exchange and The East Manchester Academy has provided an invaluable opportunity for students to explore the 147 careers in the sector, feel empowered to make informed choices as 'theatre makes' and to develop a range of transferable skills. Over time the relationship has evolved and afforded our young people amazing opportunities to see live theatre and be involved in performing. We have seen an uptake in pupils choosing performing arts subjects at BTEC tripling our cohort which is a credit to the partnership for promoting the arts. The students love the Royal Exchange and are much more culturally aware and confident because of it.
